Thanks to the vision of **Dr. Lisa Caparelli-Ruff**, Lincoln School in Joliet unveiled a brand-new kitchen facility - marking the **first time in over 20 years** that students are receiving freshly prepared meals on-site.

This state-of-the-art upgrade addresses long-standing barriers to student wellness. The facility features food prep stations, modern refrigeration, and hydroponic gardens - all made possible by partnerships with community donors such as

ExxonMobil and Bay's Investment Company.

McKinney Vento

- ~ In FY24 MKV/Area 1 identified and served over 19,000 students facing housing insecurity and/or homelessness.
- ~ With the remainder of ARP funds, Area 1 continued to grow its relationship with Evergreen Referral GPS (therapy and counseling resource) and created a program that could be liquidated over a longer period of time than originally planned through ARP funding. \$40,000 was put into that program solely for therapy and counseling sessions for MKV students. In doing so, that allowed us to free up funds in our current McKinney-Vento Continuation grant as it was greatly needed due to the completion of ARP funds as of 9/30/24.
- ~ In addition, we partnered with Dick's Sporting goods purchasing 100 bicycles to assist MKV students with transportation to and from school or to and from a potential job as well as to assist students struggling with chronic truancy. We also purchased bike locks, helmets and other safety gear. The benefits of exercise and feeling a sense of belonging were an added bonus. We also partnered with Great Clips and purchased roughly 3 thousand dollars' worth of gift cards for haircuts (hygiene). This was in addition to hygiene kits for both boys and girls, suitcases with wheels for those having to move regularly, coats, hats, gloves, socks etc. We also purchased cases of sensory items such as fidgets etc. for MKV students in Special Ed or for students experiencing trauma.
- ~Lincoln School recently introduced a new therapy support dog to help enhance students' emotional well-being and create a more supportive learning environment. The dog, trained to provide comfort and companionship, will be available during the school day to assist students dealing with stress, anxiety, or other emotional challenges. Staff members report that the presence of the dog has already had a calming effect on many students, encouraging positive interactions and fostering a sense of safety and connection throughout the school.

IN CLOSINGAs we close out this edition of our newsletter, we encourage you to stay connected and involved in the incredible work happening across Will County. Your partnership continues to inspire our efforts and drive positive change in education. Be sure to look out for future updates, resources, and opportunities to engage with the ROE as we work together to support every learner's journey.
